6	of wildfire monitoring satellites that provide moni-

8	eters, burned area, intensity, severity, and the detec-
9	tion of fires with a low false-positive rate;
10	(2) to use the data acquired under paragraph
11	(1), and any analyses relating to that data—
12	(A) to detect, assess, respond to, and man-
13	age wildfires and rangeland fires; and
14	(B) to ensure the safety and effectiveness
15	of prescribed fire treatments;
16	(3) to develop information-sharing partnerships

8	AGREEMENTS.
9	(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
10	(1) Cooperative funds agreement.—The
11	term "cooperative funds agreement" means an
12	agreement under—
13	(A) the Act of June 30, 1914 (commonly
14	known as the "Cooperative Funds Act") (16
15	U.S.C. 498); or
16	(B) section 1 of the Act of March 3, 1925
17	(16 U.S.C. 572).
18	(2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
19	the Secretary, acting through the Chief of the For-
20	est Service.
21	(b) Treatment.—
22	(1) In general.—Except as provided in para-
23	graph (2), notwithstanding any other provision of
24	law, regulation, or agency decision, the Secretary

1	shall fulfill the obligations of the Federal Govern-
2	ment with respect to each cooperative funds agree-
3	ment in effect on or after the date of enactment of
4	this Act.
5	(2) Exceptions.—The Secretary may waive
6	the applicability of paragraph (1) to a cooperative
7	funds agreement if—
8	(A) the Secretary determines that 1 or
9	more parties to the cooperative funds agree-
0	ment have not fulfilled the obligations of the
1	parties under the cooperative funds agreement;
2	or
3	(B) fulfilling the obligations of the Federal
4	Government with respect to the cooperative
5	funds agreement would violate section 1341 of
6	title 31, United States Code.
7	(c) Limitations.—
8	(1) FEDERAL EMPLOYEES.—A Federal em-
9	ployee (including seasonal, permanent seasonal, and
20	temporary employees) hired using funds provided
21	under a cooperative funds agreement shall not, for
22	the duration of the cooperative funds agreement, be
23	subject to—
24	(A) any limitation on hiring (commonly re-
25	ferred to as a "hiring freeze");

1	(B) any reduction in force; or
2	(C) any deferred resignation or voluntary
3	early retirement program.
4	(2) Non-federal funds.—The non-Federal
5	funds provided to the Secretary pursuant to a coop-
6	erative funds agreement shall not be subject to any
7	limitation on spending
